


Connect with Local Flower Farmers & Florists

PCD 2025 Board Member Election - Important Dates

Ballots must be returned or postmarked by February 28th, 2025

Ballots will be mailed to eligible voters* on February 7th, 2025, and should arrive within 1-2 weeks, depending on your mailing address location. If you intend to vote in-person at the annual celebration, you will need a valid form of identification.

*Eligible voters are registered voters who reside within the boundaries of the District. Voter information must match the Pierce County Auditor's voter database.


Silvopasture Workshop




