Agricultural Ditch Maintenance Workshop

Are you concerned about seasonal flooding of your property from a private agricultural drainage ditch? Are you interested in improving the benefits of private agricultural ditches on your land beyond just moving water? Pierce Conservation District in cooperation with staff from the Washington State Dept. of Fish & Wildlife and the Pierce County Agriculture Program will discuss proper steps to take to improve drainage from a private agricultural ditch as well as implementing Best Management Practices to add habitat benefits. Workshop participants will be offered a free screening of proposed agricultural drainage projects (normally a \$500 expense) by county experts. Participants might also qualify for BMP cost share on approved private agricultural drainage ditch projects that improve system benefits.
