We're Hiring!

PCD is hiring a team of seasonal Harvest Leaders and Fruit Tree Assessors for our Gleaning program. **Please note that full job descriptions will be posted to our website on May 9th, as well as a link to apply.**

Harvest Leader: responsible for leading volunteers in fruit harvests across the county, and assuring produce gets dropped off to local hunger relief organizations and other collaborators. Harvest Leaders are also able to take home a portion of harvest.

Fruit Tree Assessor: responsible for assessing fruit and fruit bearing plants for pest and disease issues, documentation and providing recommendations for mitigation at each site. We offer an in-depth education in fruit-specific pest and disease identification.

Compensation for both positions will include mileage reimbursement, and a wage of \$17 per hour. The season runs June through September and hours vary for each position.
