

Volunteer for Martin Luther King Jr. Day!

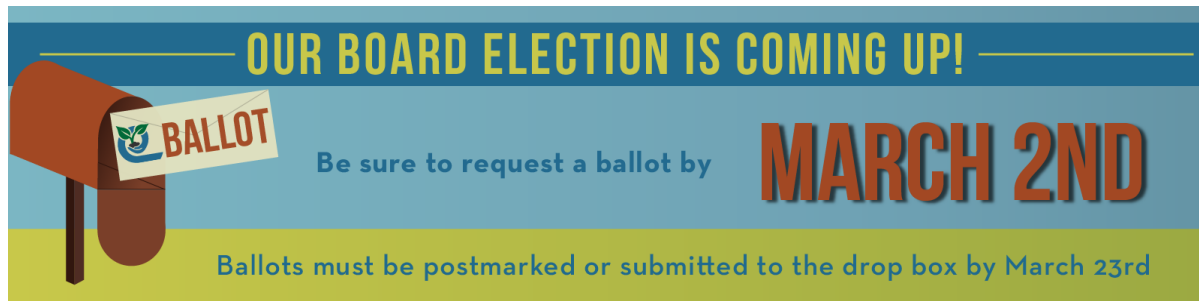

What is the Annual Native Plant Sale?

A nonprofit sale run by the Pierce Conservation District - with a mission to get environmentally friendly native plants to our residents as easily and cheaply as possible! Our plants are bare root or plug stock, which means they do not come in pots or burlap bags (your order will come bundled in a plastic bag). They are conservation-grade plants with well-developed roots; and they are easy to handle, transport, and install. Unlike most plant sellers, we make sure these plants are specially grown by our partners from hyper-local seed sources, so you'll know these plants will do well in our climate.
