


Whittier Park Habitat Stewardship

Edible Garden Workshop Series Has Started!


Explore the *basics of successful vegetable gardening in the Pacific Northwest—from seed to table.*

Get Paid to Plant Cover Crops

Are you a farmer using cover crops in your operation? Interested in learning more about harnessing the potential of cover crops for soil health? Pierce Conservation District wants to partner with you! **PCD can reimburse you up to \$150/acre to plant cover crops in 2022.** Eligible expenses include seed, inoculant, fertilizer, labor and equipment rental for establishing cover crops.

Looking for equipment to seed cover crops?

We can help you there too! We have a [larger no-till seed drill](#) available to use, and soon we will have a [Woods compact seeder](#) available for smaller operations. We also have a [flail mower](#) that is perfect for terminating cover crops.


