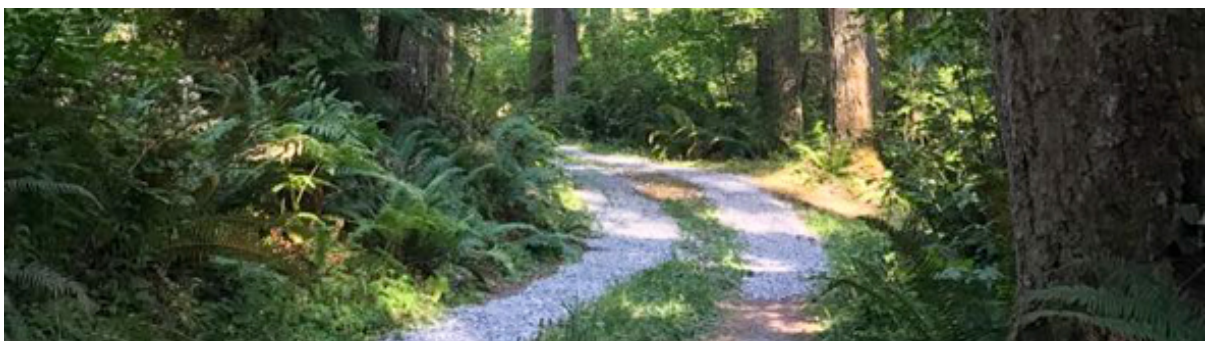
Spring Garden Fest

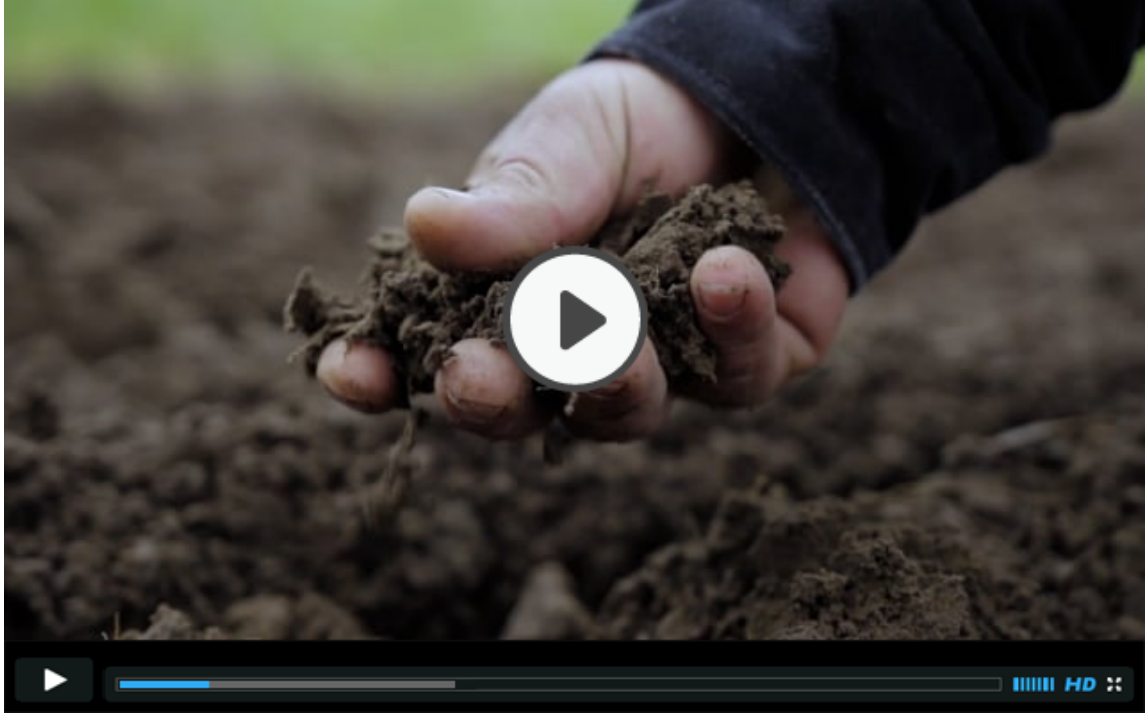


Farm Equipment Rentals
