
Silas High School Students Install Rain Garden

Get Paid to Plant Cover Crops!

Are you a farmer using cover crops in your operation? Interested in learning more about harnessing the potential of cover crops for soil health? Pierce Conservation District wants to partner with you! PCD is partnering with the Pierce County Agriculture Program to reimburse you up to \$150/acre to plant cover crops in 2022. Eligible expenses include seed, inoculant, fertilizer, labor and equipment rental for establishing cover crops. USDA to Provide Approximately \$6 Billion to Commodity and Specialty Crop Producers Impacted by 2020 and 2021 Natural Disasters

First Wave of Payments Based on Crop Insurance Data

The U. S Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced that commodity and specialty crop producers impacted by natural disaster events in 2020 and 2021 will soon begin receiving emergency relief payments totaling approximately \$6 billion through the Farm Service Agency's (FSA) new [Emergency Relief Program \(ERP\)](#), to offset crop yield and value losses. Excessive heat is included as an eligible cause of loss for producers, so if your farm suffered losses due to last summer's heat wave in June, you may be eligible for emergency relief payments.
