\$[FNAME|Customer|Guest]\$, Pierce Conservation District is holding an [election for its board of supervisors](#). The District will not be holding in-person elections this year. To vote, eligible voters must [request a mail-in ballot](#).

TO VOTE

Eligible voters must be registered Pierce County voters who reside within the District boundaries, which includes: Unincorporated Pierce County, City of Bonney Lake, City of Buckley, City of Dupont, City of Fircrest, City of Gig Harbor, City of Lakewood, City of Milton, City of Orting, City of Puyallup, Town of Steilacoom, City of Sumner, City of Tacoma, and City of University Place.

The last day and time that voters can request ballots from the District is **July 20, 2022 by 4:30 pm**. There are two ways to request your ballot

When to submit ballots?

By Mail: Ballots returned by mail must be post-marked no later than Election Day, **August 10, 2022, and be received no later than August 17, 2022** in order to be counted. Ballots received after August 17, 2022 will not be counted.

By Dropbox: Ballots returned by other means must be returned and placed in the locked ballot box at 308 West Stewart Avenue in Puyallup, WA, **no later than 4:30 pm on Election Day, August 10, 2022**

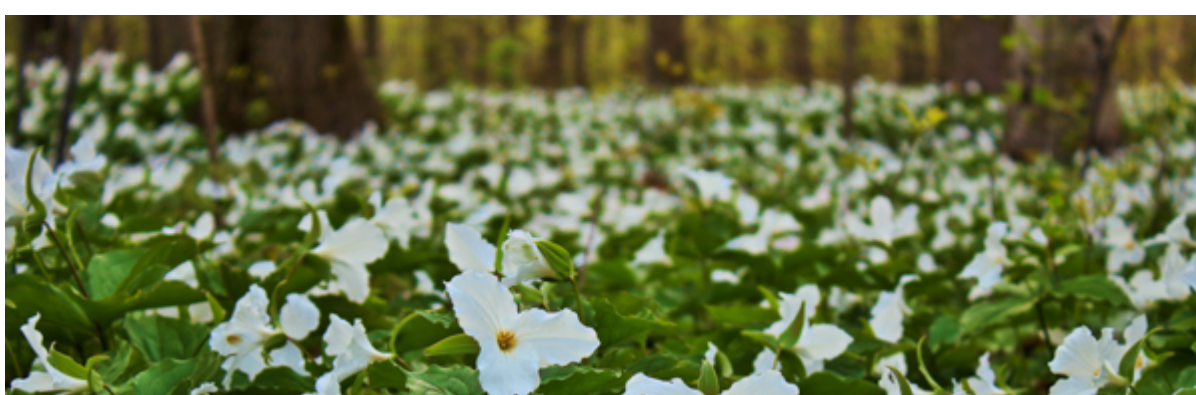

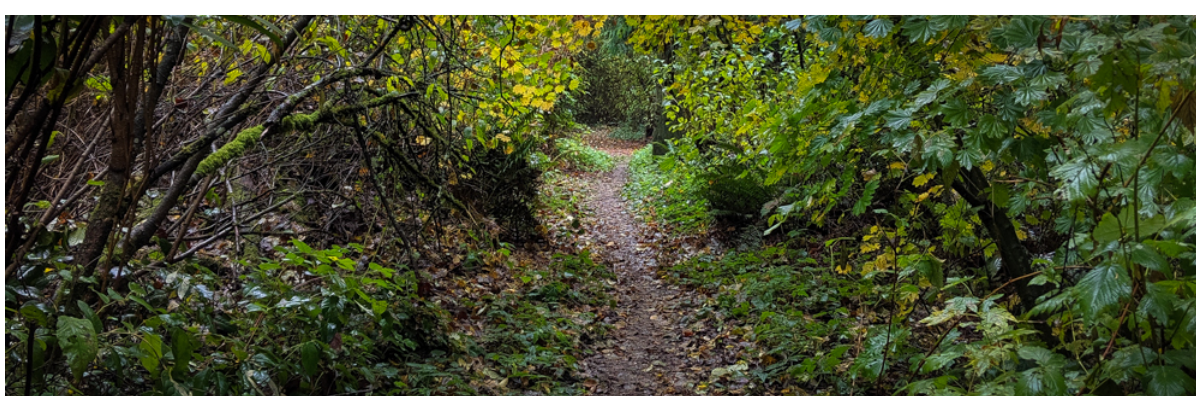

PCD Closing Volunteer Water Quality Monitoring Programs, Adding More Support For Streamside Restoration Projects



We are saddened to let you know that after 20 plus years of monitoring and over 2,000 engaged volunteers, we are closing the Stream Team and Lake Monitoring Programs. In 1994 the Stream Team Program began with 5 streams and has since expanded to monitoring more than 20 streams around Pierce County. Since 2000, the Cities of Lakewood, Bonney Lake and Milton have participated in lake monitoring programs on 7 different lakes. We provided key watershed health data to our partners and agencies to help them make informed water quality decisions. This data was featured in PCD annual reports and quarterly newsletters to our partners and volunteers.

Thank you to all our volunteers for their many years of monitoring efforts.

Why are we making this change? We decided to transition our Stream Team and Lake Monitoring Programs to a more robust Habitat Stewardship program where we will be working with community members to restore streamside habitat and improve habitat and water quality conditions. This transition will allow us to better serve and grow our active Habitat Stewards, support a larger community volunteer base to support those Habitat Stewards, and directly improve our local natural resources.

USDA to Provide Approximately \$6 Billion to Commodity and Specialty Crop Producers Impacted by 2020 and 2021 Natural Disasters

First Wave of Payments Based on Crop Insurance Data

The U. S Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced that commodity and specialty crop producers impacted by natural disaster events in 2020 and 2021 will soon begin receiving emergency relief payments totaling approximately \$6 billion through the Farm Service Agency's (FSA) new [Emergency Relief Program \(ERP\)](#) to offset crop yield and value losses. Excessive heat is included as an eligible cause of loss for producers, so if your farm suffered losses due to last summer's heat wave in June, you may be eligible for emergency relief payments.
