The sale is **limited to residents in the cities of Tacoma and Puyallup and Unincorporated Pierce County**. Customers can buy up to **three trees** each time PCD holds a sale for a total of up to 6 trees per property.

With the purchase of a tree, customers also receive a free educational workshop and a slow-release watering bucket.

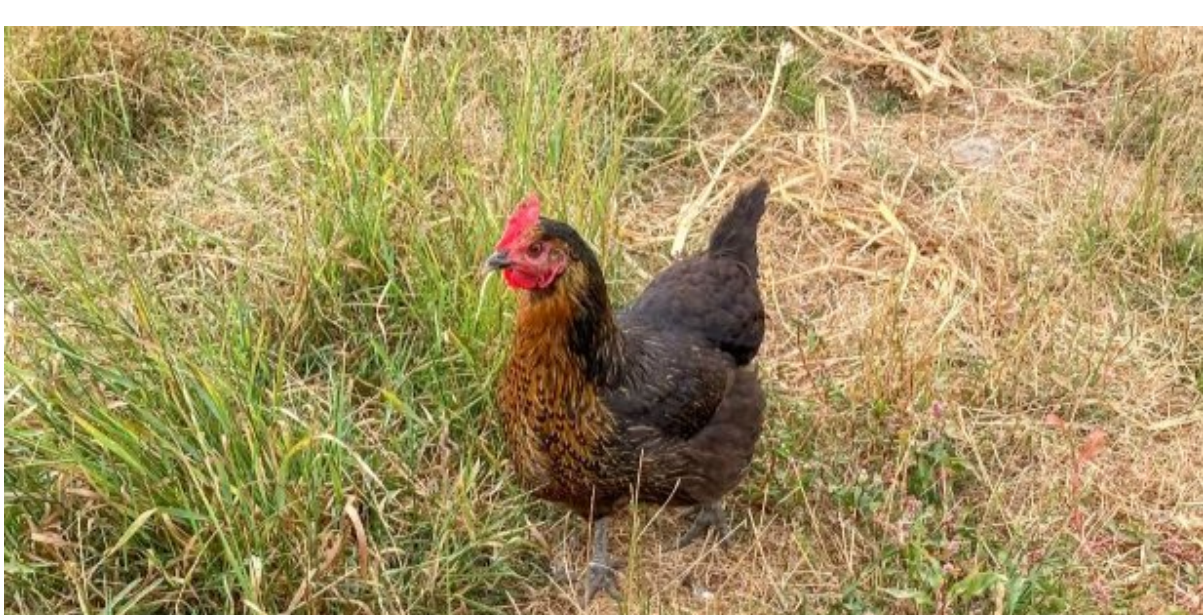

Vote in Our Board Election!

Would you like to have a say in how Pierce Conservation District is run? Vote in our upcoming board election.

There are **two ways to participate** in the District Election.

1. **In person** - You may appear [in person at the Pioneer Park Pavilion](#), 330 South Meridian in Puyallup, between 4 PM and 8 PM on March 15, 2023, and vote in person. You will be required to show identification to verify that you are a qualified voter.
2. **By mail** - [Request a ballot](#) by February 22nd at 4:30pm.
 - Ballots returned by mail must be post-marked no later than Election Day, March 15, 2023, and be received no later than March 22, 2023, in order to be counted. Ballots received after March 22, 2023 will not be counted.
 - Locked ballot box at PCD office -- Ballots returned by other means must be returned and placed in the locked ballot box at 308 West Stewart Avenue in Puyallup no later than 3 PM on Election Day, March 15, 2023.

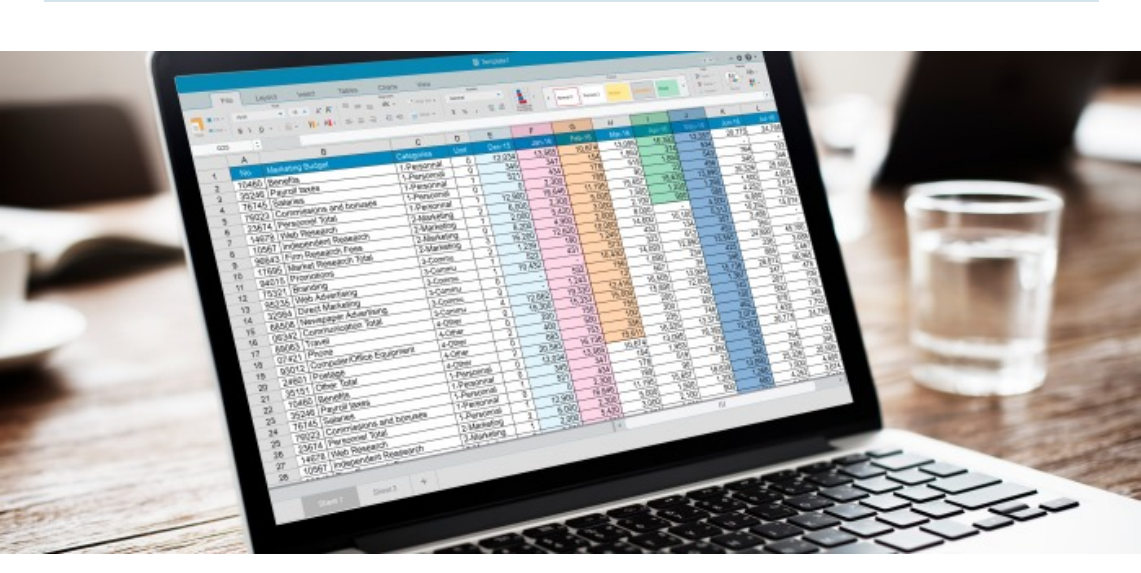

Hiring Senior Director of Finance and Administration

Pierce Conservation District seeks a full-time [Senior Director of Finance and Administration](#). This is an administrative position of Pierce Conservation District. The employee occupying this position reports to the Executive Director and will work closely with the Board of Supervisors, all Program Directors and staff of the organization to support them in the delivery of our mission.

The ideal candidate will have strong working knowledge and experience in managing human resources and experience in supporting business and operation functions of a mid-sized organization. A keen understanding of budgets, finance, grants procurement, and program administration are an absolute requirement. A previous track record of successfully working with a board of directors and other elected and/or appointed officials is preferred and cultivating a team of professionals to excel in program delivery. Pierce Conservation District staff are represented by the Washington Federation of State Employees. This is a non-represented senior management position, and experience with unions and collective bargaining processes is desired. Starting Salary \$99,816, with competitive benefits. Position is “hybrid,” with some remote work possible, but with onsite work at Puyallup office required. Position is open until filled, with a desired start date of **March 1, 2023**.

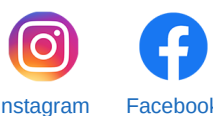
[Tilth Alliance](#) is now accepting applications for the [Washington State Organic and Sustainable Farming Fund](#) (WSOSFF).

Applications are **due Feb. 19, 2023**.

This opportunity is available to **farmers seeking financial assistance to support projects that will improve the economic viability, social impacts, or environmental sustainability of their farm businesses and/or community**. The goal of the grants is to improve farm operations through the use of sustainable practices such as crop diversification or environmentally-safe waste management.

Grant requests can be made **up to \$10,000**.
