
FREE workshop: Starting Your Farm

Garden Bugs Workshop, May 20th and 23rd


The Garden Bugs workshop goes over preventing and tackling problems in the garden with safe remedies, specific for vegetable gardening in Western Washington.

Sustainable Farms and Fields Funding is Here!

Application Deadline: June 1st

Contact the Farm Team ASAP if interested

PCD obtained funding to provide FREE cover crop and pasture seed this spring. This funding is available to landowners working with [our farm team](#) to implement pasture rejuvenation and cover crop seeding using no-till and reduced tillage seeding methods.

To be eligible for funding, projects must be completed between July 14th, 2023 - June 30th, 2024. This will allow us to provide cost share for practices that sequester carbon in the ground and prevent nitrous oxide into the atmosphere. These practices include roofs for [manure storage](#) structures and cross fencing to facilitate [rotational grazing](#). Volunteers Needed for Pt Defiance Flower & Garden Festival






South Prairie Creek Preserve Work Party

Starting soon on farms and orchards around Pierce County


The Gleaning Project is a volunteer-powered program of Harvest Pierce County that works to reduce local produce waste, provide more fresh food to those in need, and build community.



But marine shorelines are important for fish too!
