This workshop is a two-part series about the use of biochar as a soil amendment. You can attend just one or both.


The Science of Biochar


Orca Recovery Day

partnering with the [Puyallup Historical](#)


[Hatchery Foundation](#) to make this




How To Appreciate A Rain Garden
