




Native Plant Pre-Sale Open Now!



Hands-On Biochar Workshop

Following the online webinar with Nate Stacey from the Tilth Alliance, the Farm Team at Pierce Conservation District hosted an informative workshop on the fascinating process of producing biochar. Allan Warren, a biochar enthusiast and former PCD Communications and Development Director, conducted a live demonstration and shared his personal experience using biochar in his garden. Warren utilizes his woodworking byproducts and compost material to create his homemade biochar. He uses this soil amendment to sequester carbon, increase plant productivity, and improve overall soil structure.


WSU Broccoli Harvest


Green Puyallup Day



Celebrating a Historically Successful Gleaning Season

The 2023 gleaning season has almost come to a close and has already hit a record high of harvested and distributed produce, weighing in at 58,380 pounds. Approximately 38,000 pounds of produce harvested by the Gleaning Project have gone directly to Hunger Relief Organizations to feed our community members in need. Close to 20,000 pounds went to our new pilot, the Closed Loop Community program which diverts fruit that would otherwise go to waste due to its pest and disease issues to local makers for their cideries, mead, and jams, and to local livestock farmers to feed their animals. 
The Salmon (and Students!) Keep Coming!

As the salmon keep returning to Clarks Creek, so do the students. The PCD education team, in partnership with the [Puyallup Historical Hatchery Foundation](#), is about halfway through the hatchery field trip season. Over **seven hundred** 4th grade students from the Puyallup School District have already toured the hatchery, learned the salmon life cycle, and spotted salmon spawning in the creek.
