



PLANTS FOR SHADE OR UNDERSTORY PLANTING

Characteristics:

- Full to part shade tolerance
- Pacific Northwest native plant species
- Organized by height
- Also consider: Vine maple (*Acer circinatum*), Red Huckleberry (*Rubus parvifolium*), Salmonberry (*Rubus spectabilis*), Osoberry (*Oemleria cerasiformis*), Redtwig (Red osier) dogwood (*Cornus sericea*) . . .

LOW-GROWING NATIVE GROUNDCOVERS FOR SHADE / PART SHADE



Low Oregon grape
(*Mahonia nervosa*)

Evergreen / Size: ~1-3 ft / Full to part shade / Well-drained to moist soils; drought tolerant when mature.

False Solomon's seal
(*Smilacina racemosa*)

Size: 1-3 ft / Full shade to part shade/ Moist to well-drained soils, drought tolerant once established.



Deer fern
(*Blechnum spicant*)

Size: typ. 1-2 ft / Part to full shade / Moist to moderately dry soils, drought tolerant once established.

MEDIUM-SIZED NATIVE SHRUBS FOR SHADE / PART SHADE



Snowberry
(*Symphoricarpos albus*)

Size: typ. to ~4.5 ft / Sun to full shade / Moist to dry soils /drought tolerant once established / excellent erosion control.



Salal
(*Gaultheria shallon*)

Evergreen, slow-growing, thicket forming shrub. Size: ~3-5 ft / Shade to part shade/ Moist to well-drained soils / fruit and flowers benefit wildlife /drought tolerant once established.



Sword fern
(*Polystichum ovatum*)

Mostly evergreen large fern. Size: typ. to ~4.5 ft / Part to full shade / Moist to moderately dry soils / Drought tolerant once established. Plant in groups of 3-5.

LARGE NATIVE SHRUBS FOR SHADE / PART-SHADE



Evergreen huckleberry
(*Vaccinium ovatum*)

Size: typ. 4-10 ft / Part to full shade / Moist to moderately dry soils, drought tolerant once established.



Western beaked hazelnut (Filbert)
(*Corylus cornuta var. cornuta*)

Deciduous, thicket-forming, large shrub t. Size: 10-20 ft / Shade to sun / Moist to well-drained soils / high drought tolerance / nuts popular with people and wildlife / excellent erosion control.



Thimbleberry
(*Rubus parviflorus*)

Deciduous flowering and fruiting, thicket-forming shrub. Size: typ. 4-8 ft / Part shade to sun / Very moist to moderately dry soils; prefers damp soils / excellent erosion control.
