



Livestock Manure Hauling and Removal

Composted livestock manure is an excellent source of nutrients and organic matter. However, on small acreages or farms with high concentrations of animals, it can be “too much of a good thing.” Overapplying livestock manure has several negative outcomes. On the other hand, storing your large manure pile for a long time can have negative outcomes as well.

Overapplying manure can –

- High nitrate concentrations in forages can cause nitrate toxicity in livestock
- Potentially cause health issues or increase parasite load in livestock
- Increase risk of nutrients from livestock manure – nitrogen, phosphorus – concentrating in ditches, streams or wetlands, ponded areas, or leach below the root zone into your groundwater
- Increase risk of bacteria from livestock manure concentrating in ditches, streams or wetlands, ponded areas, or leach below the root zone into your groundwater

What can you do?

- Cover your livestock manure pile to minimize contact with rainwater
- Pierce Conservation District can provide technical assistance and resources for how to compost, store, handle, and spread livestock manure to prevent overapplications of manure
- Haul livestock excess manure off site to a composting facility
- Refer to the resources below for where to haul and dispose of your excess livestock manure
