

Wildfire Ready Neighbors Project Sheet

Prepare: Work with PCD staff to identify appropriate projects based on your home assessment. WRN projects can be proposed for a variety and combination of small projects with emphasis decreasing the further away from a home.

Tools: Depending on project size, check local equipment rental services for: dump trailer, motorized wheelbarrow, hand tools, and hardscape material delivery

Installation: Choose 1 of these 3 options:

Choose Your Own Contractor

- Your contractor must have a current contractor's license in WA, be bonded and insured and be approved by PCD staff
- Your contractor rents and runs needed equipment
- Have a plan for brush removal
- Make sure erosion and watershed will not be impacted
- Have a plan for continued maintenance for each project (times may vary)

Do it Yourself

- Get 3 bids for needed equipment and materials
- Retain all receipts for PCD reimbursement

Let PCD Choose a Contractor

- PCD chooses a contractor through a competitive bid process and manages the install for your project

Guidelines:

- Projects can be any recommendations made during home assessment
- Can be combined with Department of Natural Resources community-focused mini-grants
- Project combinations can include but are not limited to:
 - Roof, gutter and downspout cleaning
 - Rock installation around foundations
 - Plant removal, pruning and/or replacement with fire-resistant species
